Gabrielle Thierry: The Musicality of the Water Lilies La Musicalité des Nymphéas

Colored Musical Scores inspired by Claude Monet Water Lilies Landscapes

AUGUST 30 - OCTOBER 7, 2017

Gabrielle Thierry's series of eight large-scale paintings were inspired by her rediscovery of the 'Water Lilies' landscapes by Claude Monet on view at the the Musée de l'Orangerie in Paris. She translated them into colored musical scores, working with special permission to paint on site in the gallery at the museum. The works were created over a period of 18 months from 2010 to 2012 and describe Thierry's explorations with the theory of synesthesia, where visual forms are representative of corresponding musical notes. Thierry experiences the musicality she feels is embedded in the semi-abstract impressionist paintings of Monet, which she then transcribes in abstract form on her own canvases.

Thierry resides outside of Paris in Andrésy,
France. Before devoting her career to painting
15 years ago, Thierry was an engineer
specializing in cognitive sciences and
knowledge management. She studied at the
Atelier du Carrousel - Louvre and École des
Beaux Arts in Paris and obtained a Cambridge,
UK graduate degree from Christie's Education.
This will be the first exhibition of her work in
the United States.
